

Description

Until today, Cambodia is still one of the poorest and least developed countries in Southeast Asia. In its four years under the Khmer Rouge regime and the decades of social instability that followed, Cambodia's social fabric was so utterly destroyed that many Cambodians today are struggling to trust. While its tourism is flourishing, development is not evenly distributed in the country. Many rural and remote communities remain poverty-stricken, as corruption and self-interest precedes the country's development and Tumnop Thmey is one such community. Located in Oddar Meanchey Province along the north-western part of the Khmer-Thai border, Tumnop Thmey village is home to 211 families. Most people depend on subsistence farming and plantation works for living. Tumnop Thmey primary school has two school buildings with four classrooms, providing education for 182 children (96 boys, 86 girls). The school was built by the community and the monk association with very limited resources. Due to the simple structures, the buildings have started to rot, and the school does no longer provide a hygienic and safe environment. The school buildings only have dirt floors, making them very dusty during windy weather and muddy during rain. Furthermore, the wooden roofs are rotten and do not provide shelter during the rainy season. The construction of a new school building with four fully furnished classrooms will provide the students with a higher quality learning environment. As soon as the school is able to offer the students a better and safer learning environment the quality of the education will increase and the students will be more motivated to attend classes on a regular basis and to continue to higher education.

Implementation

The school building will consist of four fully furnished classrooms. The government will support this project by providing training for the teachers, pay their salaries, provide teaching and learning materials, and teaching curriculum. The government will also continue to monitor and evaluate the school regularly. The community members will contribute to the project by providing manual labour, local resources and maintaining the building after completion. We will hire a professional contractor who will be responsible for the main construction effort as well as the purchase of construction material. The contractor will be paid in instalments after the completion of each agreed step. 5% of the total cost will be withheld for six months as a guarantee. The road conditions are quite good, so the transportation of construction materials and monitoring of the construction site will not be too difficult. The sustainability of the project is assured, as the school is a registered government school and the community has a good relationship with the authorities. We expect completion of the building in June 2015.
