Description

Daw T'Klae Post Primary School is located in Daw T' Klae Village, Phru So Township, Kayah State, Eastern Myanmar. The population is mainly from the Karenni ethnicity. The village was established more than 100 years ago and currently has a population of 2,100 residents. Students come to school from three different, surrounding villages. The majority of the population make a living from subsistence farming. The access to drinking water is difficult in this village. In 1985 the government supported the community with a primary school, which enabled children to access primary level education. In 2016 it was upgraded to a Post Primary School. Currently, 10 female teachers teach 113 students, aged 5-13. One cement school building has three rooms; one teacher's room and two classrooms. Due to the increase of student numbers over the last few years, the community built a temporary bamboo house with three classrooms. This temporary building is unstable and inadequate for students to learn in and needs to be taken down. Therefore, we will support the construction of a new school building with five fully furnished classrooms. This will provide a much better learning environment. It will also cater to the expected increase in student numbers in the coming academic year. The government is further considering adding a small building as a kindergarten, though this is not approved yet.

Implementation

We will support Daw T'Klae Post Primary School with the construction of a new school building with 5 fully furnished classrooms and a water tank. The new facility caters to up to 140 students and will provide them with a stable, secure and comfortable learning environment to focus on their educational needs. As with all our projects, the local community will be involved in the construction process. Involvement of the community is critical, as it encourages a stronger sense of ownership over the project. The villagers have agreed to contribute to the project by collecting bamboo for scaffolding, as well as provide their unskilled labour. The village committee will manage and oversee the construction process. We will hire a construction company to build the school building for us and we are going to follow-up on the construction progress regularly. The government will be responsible for the school after the construction is completed. Payments will be made in instalments, according to the progress of the construction. 5% of the total cost will be held back for six months, as a guarantee for the quality of the work. The teachers' salaries, training and follow-up is supported and managed by the government. We consider this project as low risk. The school can be accessed by car all year around. Construction will begin in January 2018 and is targeted to be completed by June 2018.
