




# Trapeang Khteas Primary School

## Description

Despite its growing tourism sector, Cambodia remains one of the poorest and least developed countries in Southeast Asia. Development is not evenly distributed in the country and many rural communities remain poverty-stricken as corruption and self-interest impede the country's growth. Trapeang Khteas Primary School is located in Trapeang Khteas Village, Svay Leu Commune, Svay Leu District, Siem Reap Province, Cambodia. The village was established in 2006 and the vast majority of the population is dependent on farming for their livelihoods. The village is home to 281 people (193 female and 88 male) in 106 households. The village has mobile phone coverage, but no local access to health care, water, or electricity. There are currently 139 kindergarten and primary-level students (78 boys and 61 girls) and five teachers (one male and four females). The students only come from the Trapeang Khteas Village, and have to travel no more than three km to get to the school. The current primary school, however, is in terrible shape, and poses significant risks to the teachers and students. Therefore, a new and standardised school building with four furnished classrooms is urgently needed to provide a safe and motivating environment for the students to reach their full potential. The Ministry of Education recently supported the construction of four new toilets, which are still in good condition, so additional toilets are not included in this proposal.

## Implementation

The Trapeang Khteas Primary School is a government registered school. The government will support the teachers' training and salaries and provide the curriculum and materials for teaching and learning. Our approach is to always involve the community in the project to encourage ownership and community development. For this project, the villagers have agreed to contribute by backfilling the foundation, fixing the school's fence, and organizing the school opening ceremony. For the actual construction, we will collaborate with a local contractor to coordinate all phases of construction and to purchase all standard materials locally. Payments will be made in instalments, according to the progress of the construction with 5% of the total cost held back for six months, as a guarantee for the quality of the work. Once the project is completed, the community will be responsible for the maintenance of the school. There is a chance of slight transportation delays during the rainy season; otherwise, this is considered a low risk project. The construction is scheduled to begin in June 2020 and is expected to be completed by December 2020.
