Programme Development

Programme Management

- manage and control budgets and the team's administrative expenses in accordance with the budget approved and internal budget regulations
- support the preparation of annual programme plans including activity planning, designing new interventions and budgeting for approval by the Country Director and Managing Director - Programmes
- monitor and evaluate programme activities, outputs and outcomes following the M&E plan developed together with our M&E team in our head office in Chiang Mai
- conduct programme reviews, develop continuation plans and phase-out strategies
- provide regular feedback and updates on current or potential programmes to the Country Director
- identify, develop and initiate new programmes and defend proposals in Project Evaluation Committee
- conduct independent site/field visits in Laos for monitoring, problem solving and managing programs (30% of your working time)
